
How to Get Tickets for *Yûryô Shitei Seki* (Prepaid Areas with Reserved Sections):

All applications will be decided by lottery. Application Period: May 27 (Mon.) – June 5 (Wed.) 5:00 p.m.

How to Get Tickets for *Yûryô Jiyû Seki* (Prepaid Areas without Reserved Sections):

Tickets will be sold at designated ticket outlets in the city from Monday, July 1st. Detailed information will be given in the June issue of <u>*Konnichiwa Nagaoka*</u>, the City Newsletter in English.







The annual giant kite battles with over 360 years of history behind them will be held at three locations in and around Nagaoka City. In the kite battles, huge kites are flown from both riverbanks, crossing over the rivers. The people on both sides of the rivers try to tangle their opponents' kite ropes with their own kite ropes high above the ground and try to pull down each other's kites until the ropes snap and break. The huge kites, brilliantly painted with figures of warrior heroes of legends or dramas, are the size of 10 *tatami* mats and made of nearly 100 sheets of paper.





Warnings against Photochemical Smog

Photochemical smog is a white fog that develops due to accumulated photochemical oxidants in the air, depending on certain meteorological conditions. Photochemical smog is generated when nitrogen oxide and hydrocarbons in exhaust fumes from factories or automobiles react to the strong ultraviolet rays of the sun.

- Q: When are photochemical smog warnings issued?
- A: Normally in May and June, the Niigata Prefectural Government issues warnings against photochemical smog when sunny days with high temperatures continue and the concentration of photochemical oxidants in the air becomes high.
- Q: How can we protect ourselves when a warning is issued?
- A: Here is some advice when a warning is issued. * Outdoor sport activities should be avoided. *Children, the elderly, and people with frail health conditions should stay indoors.
- Q: Are there any specific health problems we might have?
- A: Here is some advice if you have any health problems.
- * If your eyes hurt, turn red, or become itchy, rinse them with tap water.
- * If you have a sore throat or are coughing, gargling may be helpful.

* If these problems continue, you should see a doctor.

However, excessive worry is not necessary because these symptoms are not likely to happen immediately even after a warning is issued. For questions concerning health problems, please contact the Health Division of the Nagaoka City Office.
