Population and Households As of September 1, 2013 (compared to the previous month)







The Yamakoshi Recovery Exhibit Hall Will Open

On the 9th anniversary of the 2004 Great Chûetsu Earthquake, the Yamakoshi Recovery Exhibit Hall, nicknamed "*Orataru*," will open next to the Yamakoshi Branch Office on Wednesday, October 23rd. The exhibit hall is a facility where visitors can learn about the 2004 earthquake and the city's recovery operations for the disaster as well as the traditional lifestyle of the people living in Yamakoshi, a mountainous area. "*Orataru*" is from an old local dialect, meaning "our place."

We Can Further Reduce Burnable Trash

Compared with the previous year, the amount of burnable trash from households has been reduced by up to approximately 40% for the four months since April 2013.

Everyone's cooperation is indispensable to reduce the amount of burnable trash. Since April 2013, the city started collecting food scraps for producing biogas. Food scraps in designated prepaid pink bags are collected twice a week. Food scraps in straining nets and transparent or translucent plastic bags can be put in designated prepaid bags. However, food scraps should not be wrapped in paper because paper interferes with fermentation.

A reduction in trash handling costs, resulting from separating food scraps from burnable trash, is estimated to be approximately ¥3.5 billion in 15 years.





Enrollment in Nursery Schools

(保育園・ほいくえん / Hoikuen)

Applications for enrollment in nursery schools for the 2014 fiscal year will be accepted from Friday, November 1st to Friday November 15th. Application forms are available at each nursery school, the Child-Care Division (Hoiku Ka), or the Citizens' Affairs and Service Division (Shimin Seikatsu Ka) of each district office starting on Monday, October 21st.

Eligibility extends to infants and preschool-aged children whose parents or guardians cannot take care of them at home due to employment duties or medical reasons. Some nursery schools accept infants aged two months old and above.

Hours differ for each nursery school and fees differ depending on each household's previous year's income. For further detailed information, please contact the nursery school in which you wish to enroll your child or the Child-Care Division of the Nagaoka City Office. (Phone: 0258-39-2219)

Subsidies for Childbirth Shussan Ikuji Ichijikin

(しゅっさん いくじ いちじきん・出産育児一時金)

The city has a system to provide subsidies for childbirth. If you are a member of the National Health Insurance Policy (Kokumin Kenkô Hoken・こくみん けんこう ほけん・ 国民健康保険), you are eligible to apply for a subsidy for each child.

The subsidy is ¥420,000 per child. After an application for this system is made at the medical institution where the child was born, the city will make the necessary payment directly to the medical institution out of the fixed subsidy. A recipient can also receive the subsidy directly from the city by taking necessary steps. The rest of the amount will be given to the recipient. If medical charges exceed ¥420,000, the remaining balance should be paid directly to the medical institution. Members of any other types of insurance policy are also eligible to apply for their own childbirth subsidies.
