

Nagaoka Fireworks Conveying Our Messages of Peace Toward the World and the Future

- Nagaoka City is the only city in Niigata Prefecture to experience the misery of war devastation. On August 1st, 1945, American bombers flew over the city and dropped more than 163,000 firebombs. The air raid claimed 1,486 lives, including approximately 300 school children, and burned down 80 % of the city.
- In order not to forget this tragic fact, the city declared itself an Anti-Nuclear Peace-Advocating City on August 1st, 1984, which is earlier than any of the other municipalities in Niigata Prefecture. The city opened the Nagaoka War Damage Exhibit Hall on July 12th, 2003. This year, 2015, which marks the 70th year since the end of the Pacific War, the city enacted an ordinance to recognize August 1st as "Everlasting Peace Day."
- It is reported that war victims from Nagaoka City during the Pacific War totaled 9,596.
- The annual Nagaoka Festival has its origin in the Nagaoka Festival for Restoration from War Devastation, which was held in 1947. This initial festival provided the war-affected people with indomitable strength for reconstructing their damaged land. Nagaoka Fireworks are always launched in memory of war victims, in appreciation of the people who contributed to the safe recovery from war damage, and with prayers for world peace.



It has been 70 years since that tragic incident took place in Nagaoka. We would like to convey our messages of peace toward the world and the future.

The citizens of Nagaoka who experienced the misery of war continue to convey the importance of peace to young generations who have never personally experienced war.

Both having experienced the misery of war, the sister cities of Nagaoka and Honolulu will collaborate in presenting Nagaoka Fireworks at Pearl Harbor, Honolulu, Hawaii where the conflict between Japan and the United States broke out in 1941.

This historic event of launching Nagaoka Fireworks at Pearl Harbor after a span of 70 years truly symbolizes peace and signifies friendship between our two cities that are firmly bonded through continued peace-oriented exchange programs.

We would like to convey to the children of the world the preciousness of peace by displaying Nagaoka Fireworks in our city as well as around the world.

The Nagaoka-Honolulu Peace Exchange Commemorative Project

In memory of war victims and with prayers for world peace, the Nagaoka Civic Delegation consisting of approximately 230 members and approximately 200 people from the U.S. Military and the City and County of Honolulu will take part in various historic events to be held on Ford Island, Honolulu as follows:

Here is a warning about a fake business called "Kakû Seikyû" in Japanese. There has been an increasing number of such cases via e-mail. "Kakû Seikyû" is a fake notice demanding a false payment, which you do not have to make. If you have received any bill demanding a payment with which you have nothing to do, just ignore it and do not try to contact the sender. If you contact the sender, they will continually demand payments or they will threaten to sue you.

In order to alleviate the impact of the increase in the consumption tax rate to 8% enforced in April 2014, the national government will provide low-income earners with Temporary Welfare Benefits. The amount of this benefit for each eligible person is ¥6,000. Only people who are exempt from residential tax in 2015 are eligible. The city will send application forms to households with possible eligible persons. Please submit your application form to the city office by using the enclosed return envelope. The application period is from Tuesday, August 4th to Friday, November 20th.





The highlight of the Mishima Festival on August 16th is the Log Sawing Competition that has been held annually since 1991. The team of two contestants (in three categories of men/mixed pairs, women only, and elementary school children) who can saw through a *sugi* (Japanese cedar) log the fastest are the champions. *Sugi* is one of the major products of the Mishima District. During the final competition, contestants make the best use of all their might to saw through an approximately 70-centimeter-wide cedar log with a giant saw.

Mr. Kawauchi: We wanted to create something special for our community by using saws, which are well-known quality products in Wakino Town of the Mishima District. We came up with the idea of organizing a National Log Sawing Competition. I often shed tears when seeing children and grown-ups working hard and sweating their guts out to saw through a log, which is a driving force for our commitment to this event. A mini-version of the competition was also held in Honolulu in March 2014. We would like to treasure and hand down to future generations this exciting event as a regional cultural tradition.



How to Deal with Used Cooking Oil

You are advised not to dispose of used cooking oil in drainpipes in order to help keep the city's drainage in good condition. The city's drainpipes connected to kitchens seem to be badly soiled by used cooking oil. This has resulted in the obstruction of drainpipes and connected pumps, causing some damage to the city's water treatment facilities.

Used cooking oil should be put out at the city's designated collection sites on designated days, or absorbed with paper, rag, or solidified with a coagulant, and then put out as burnable trash.

If you wipe off the oil on your tableware or cooking utensils before washing them, you can also reduce water and detergent consumption. Your cooperation helps us protect the environment.

Health Checkups for Children Enrolling in Elementary School



There will be a health checkup for children to enroll in elementary school in April, 2016. The checkup will be offered at each elementary school of the city sometime in October.

An information postcard regarding a notice of a health checkup will be mailed to guardians in late August. If you don't receive a postcard by Monday, September 7th, please contact the School Affairs Division (Phone: 0258-39-2239).

In principle, a health checkup will be offered at a school situated in the school district where a child's residence is registered as of the date of the checkup. However, if a child is expected to move to another district, a health checkup will be possible at a school in the district.

Medical Subsidies for Children

The city has a system to provide subsidies for childbirth, hospitalized children, and children's in- and out-patient treatment.

Subsidies for Child Birth

If you are a member of the National Health Insurance Policy (Kokumin Kenkô Hoken・こくみん けんこう ほけん・国民健康保険), you are eligible to apply for a subsidy for each child.

The amount to be subsidized is ¥420,000 per child. After an application for this system is made at the medical institution where the child was born, the city will make the necessary payment directly to the institution out of the fixed subsidy. The rest of the amount will be given to the recipient.

Subsidies for Hospitalized Children

In accordance with the newly revised regulation, elementary school children are also eligible for in-patient treatment. However, these subsidies are only offered to households whose total income for the previous year is lower than the standardized amount just like the child allowance subsidies.

Children's In- and Out-Patient Treatment Subsidies

Out-Patient Treatment

- Households with one or two children Subsidies are available for children up to and including the third grade of elementary school.
- Households with three or more children (including 18 years of age) Subsidies are available for children up to and including 15 years of age.

In-Patient Treatment

- Households with one or two children Subsidies are available for children up to and including 12 vears of age.
- Households with three or more children (including 18 years of age) Subsidies are available for children up to and including 15 years of age.
