A Talk for the New Year ~ Connecting Younger Generations for the Future ~

In order to prevent depopulation and to encourage younger generations to continue to live in Nagaoka, return to Nagaoka, or move into Nagaoka, the city inaugurated a strategic project named the Nagaoka Rejuvenation Project. Because younger generations are expected to be responsible for rejuvenating Nagaoka, the Nagaoka Youth Employment Organization was established so that students, businesses from the industrial and financial sectors, and the administrative sector could come together to seek new potential for the future of the city.

Mayor Tamio Mori had a talk with four board members of the organization about some special features of Nagaoka and their expectations of Nagaoka. Here are some highlights from their impressive and inspiring talk:

- Our favorite things in Nagaoka are locally-grown vegetables, rice, *sake*, Nagaoka Fireworks, special seasonal features, the mountains, the ocean, Japan's longest river, the list could go on and on.
- We are proud of Nagaoka's traditions and culture based on the teaching known as the spirit of One Hundred Sacks of Rice.

- Various events and festivals in each of the city's 11 districts are all unique and interesting.
- We would like to develop Nagaoka into a place where many tourists come and visit, where mothers and fathers can enjoy child-rearing, and where younger generations are happy to live.
- We hope that we can share our glowing love for Nagaoka with other people of younger generations through promoting our activities as members of the Nagaoka Youth Employment Organization.

Enjoy Child-Rearing in Nagaoka

As one of the strategic programs for the Nagaoka Rejuvenation Project, the city is trying to provide an ideal child-rearing environment in which pregnancy, childbirth, and child-rearing are systematically and properly supported.

In addition to the five current child-rearing support facilities, more multi-generational child-rearing support facilities will open in the other eight districts of the city by April 2016.

So far, approximately 270,000 visitors enjoy various activities annually at these facilities where everyone can have a good time even on rainy or snowy days throughout the year. These community-oriented facilities provide various programs based on their local history, lifestyle, and natural environment.

Basic Principle:

- In collaboration with schools, homes, and communities, the city will foster children who respect and admire Nagaoka, their hometown.
- In order to treasure and nurture each child's potential, the city will make efforts to ensure consistent childrearing support and education.

- The city will nurture children who are well-motivated to learn and grow by providing opportunities for beneficial experiences and educational programs.
- The city will provide an educational environment where children can have equal learning opportunities irrespective of their family's financial situation by lowering the costs for child care and education.
- The city will provide an environment where children can be safe and lead rich lives by developing proper child-rearing and educational facilities.





Evacuation Plan in Case of Nuclear Accidents

The city established an evacuation plan in case of serious nuclear accidents at the Kashiwazaki-Kariwa Nuclear Power Plant. Vital points suggested by the plan for residents within the 5-30-kilometer-radius areas are:

Take Shelter Indoors

Immediately after any serious nuclear accident, residents in the 5-30-kilometer-radius areas should take shelter indoors to protect themselves from radiation by remaining inside a building such as their own home. Ventilators and air conditioners should be turned off and doors and


windows should be closed. If you cannot return to your own home immediately after a nuclear power accident, take shelter in a building such as the nearest public facility.



Evacuation Orders


According to radiation levels monitored and announced by the government, the city will order residents in the affected areas to evacuate to areas that are less affected.

Where to and How to Evacuate





On July 28th, 2015, the Nuclear Safety Countermeasures Study Group, which is organized by all the municipalities of Niigata Prefecture, agreed upon the partnering municipalities for accepting evacuees.



Promoting Nishikigoi (Multi-Colored Ornamental Carp) around the World

Being the original birthplace of Nishikigoi, the Cities of Nagaoka and Ojiya designated Nishikigoi as their respective City Fish in October 2014. Both cities established the Committee to Promote the Nishikigoi Industry in the hopes that our communities be rejuvenated through the breeding and marketing of Nishikigoi around the world. The committee also aims for the Nishikigoi industry to be certified as a Globally Important Agricultural Heritage System.



On November 27th, 2015, a 2.5-meter-wide aquarium was set up on the first floor of the East Wing of City Hall Plaza – *Aôre* Nagaoka. Visitors can enjoy

watching 12 Nishikigoi (approximately 40 centimeters long) with different colors and patterns swimming gracefully.

There is another aquarium of Nishikigoi at Orataru, the Yamakoshi Recovery Exhibit Hall in the Yamakoshi District, which has attracted 50,000 visitors so far for the two years since its establishment. The city presented Nagaoka's Nishikigoi to the Embassies of Albania, Armenia, Canada, Egypt, and Saudi Arabia.

The Yamakoshi District enjoys welcoming many overseas admirers and buyers of Nishikigoi. Japan's annual export of fishery products accounts for about 3 billion yen, most of which is Nishikigoi from Niigata Prefecture. About 70% - 80% of the Nishikigoi being raised in Niigata Prefecture are exported to over 30 countries.


