The One Hundred Sacks of Rice Festival is a celebration of the autumnal harvest. It is also an occasion to hand down to future generations Nagaoka's historic event cherished by the Spirit of One Hundred Sacks of Rice.

The Spirit of One Hundred Sacks of Rice is a concept stressing that city development is dependent on education. Nagaokans take pride in and draw courage from this teaching, which originated in a historic event that took place after the end of the civil war of 1868.

The festival will have many fun-filled programs including street performances, a 46.6-km relay, and a flea market. There will also be a parade (starting around 3:35 p.m.) of approximately 500 people dressed in *samurai* warrior costumes from the *Boshin* Civil War of 1868 and ancient gorgeous costumes of the Makino Clan going up to Edo (present-day Tokyo) for alternate-year attendance to the *Shôgun*. A skit dramatizing the historic One Hundred Sacks of Rice story will also be performed.

Continuing to grow and evolve, this year's fireworks show featured more spectacular Niagara Falls Fireworks with Super Grand Star Mine Fireworks and Phoenix Fireworks Wishing for Recovery in the image of the Olympic Games, which amazed over one million spectators from home and abroad. The Nagaoka Grand Fireworks Show also helped the city further promote communications with overseas countries.

The Nagaoka "Glocal (Global + Local)" Educational Project Based on the Spirit of One Hundred Sacks of Rice



In order to foster the growth of younger generations who will play leading roles in international society, eight students from the Nagaoka University of Technology and the Nagaoka Institute of Design were chosen for the 2017 *Glocal* Educational Project in which they will learn and work for three to six months at various overseas research institutions and firms located in Australia, India, France, the UK, the USA, and Vietnam. A New Type of Prepaid Bags for Burnable Trash



Yellow prepaid bags with gussets for burnable trash will be available from October 2017. There will be three sizes: medium (about 25 liters), small (about 10 liters), and super small (about 5 liters). The amount of trash that can fit in these bags is the same as previous bags. However, the new bags with gussets will allow you to put trash evenly into

the corners of the bags. Some citizens came up with this idea of adding gussets to the prepaid bags and requested the city to supply them.

You can still use yellow prepaid bags without gussets as usual for burnable trash. Prepaid yellow bags for burnable trash, prepaid blue bags for non-burnable trash, and prepaid pink bags for food scraps are available at convenience stores and supermarkets that have this sign.

Special Discount Bus Tickets for Local Students

Echigo Kôtsû Co. offers special discount bus tickets to students studying at academic institutions in Nagaoka City. This service is named "Gakusei Kôryû Choinori Bus (a casual bus ride for students' exchange programs)," in which the bus fare between Nagaoka Station and each institution is just ¥100 per trip.

How to Ride the *Choinori* Bus:

- Fill out an application form, available at your campus store, with your name and the purpose of your ride and submit your application form there. Then, purchase a booklet of tickets with 11 ¥100 tickets for ¥1,000 there.
- Use any regular bus service provided by Echigo Kôtsû Co. between your school and Nagaoka Station.
- When getting out of the bus, put one of the \forall 100 bus tickets into the fare box beside the driver.

How to Apply for Enrollment in Nursery Schools or Kindergartens

A new comprehensive support system for child-rearing was implemented throughout Japan in April 2015. Under this system the child-rearing support facilities for preschool-aged children are categorized into four types. If you wish to enroll your child in either one of these facilities, you must apply for both approval (nintei shinsei/にんてい しんせい・認定申請) and enrollment (nvûen môshikomi/にゅうえん もうしこみ・入園申し込み).





This Month's Useful Japanese Expressions Kinkyû Sokuhô Mêru

(きんきゅう そくほう メール・緊急速報メール)

Kinkyû Sokuhô Mêru (Emergency Flash Mail or Area Mail) will inform you about possible approaching risks due to earthquakes or tsunami with Emergency Earthquake Warnings or Tsunami Warnings. Disaster and Evacuation Information issued by Niigata Prefecture or Nagaoka City will also be sent out to cell phone users.

These pieces of information will be sent out all at once to cell phone users in the areas where such risks are expected. Emergency messages will show up on your cell phone screen along with loud alarms. Please try to read these important messages.

If you don't understand any message written in Japanese, please try to translate it into your own language by using translation features or websites. Evacuate immediately if the message warns you to do so.



Medical Subsidies for Children (Revised as of October 2016)

Out-Patient Treatment

- Households with one or two children
 Subsidies are available for children until they graduate
 from elementary school.
 (to be revised in October 2017)
- Households with three or more children Subsidies are available for children until they graduate from junior high school.

In-Patient Treatment

Regardless of the number of children in a household, subsidies are available for children until they graduate from junior high school.

Eligible recipients must complete certain procedures to receive these subsidies.
