Teikyo Nagaoka High School Made the Final Four in the 2018 Winter Cup

The 2018 National High School Basketball Winter Cup 2018 was held in Tokyo at the end of December. The Teikyo Nagaoka team has made the Final Four three years in a row. Nearly 4,300 local teams joined the nationwide preliminary competitions. The Teikyo Nagaoka team has represented Niigata Prefecture five years in a row.

In the quarterfinal game, Teikyo Nagaoka High School defeated Meisei High School of Miyagi Prefecture (the 2017 champion team), 69 to 60. The team's incredible efforts have helped the City of Nagaoka become known as a "Town of Basketball" throughout Japan.

Nagaoka-Based Technological Innovation Projects A Robot Manufacturing Entrepreneur

The city's project to help students launch new businesses has welcomed the birth of the first student -entrepreneur.

Based on the new technology of cycloid reducers, which are used in the joints of industrial robots, students and graduates of the National

Institute of Technology, Nagaoka College established a robot -manufacturing company and named it Ju-ichi, Big Stone Corporation. Mr. Katsuki Oishi (a fifth-year student) is the president. The City of Nagaoka provided financial support for the corporation to establish its business.

A cycloid reducer is a device attached to a motor that efficiently produces power at a lower rotational speed. Renovating the basic structure and gears, the company has achieved higher strength along with downsizing and lightening the device. This technological renovation allows the device to be applied in nursing-care robots and household electrical appliances.

A patent application and further development in collaboration with other major manufacturers are in the works. On January 9th at Nadec BASE (on Ote Street), they introduced the newly established corporation. Mr. Oishi emphasized their determination stressing, "Many people of Nagaoka from academic institutions, firms, banks, and the municipal office of Nagaoka helped us establish this corporation and further develop robot technology. We will endeavor to become a well-known robot manufacturer."

The Minister's Award National Institute of Technology, Nagaoka College

On December 15th, 2018, the 3rd Nuclear Decommission Challenge Robot Competition for the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant was held at the Japan Atomic Energy Agency in Naraha Town in Fukushima Prefecture. Contestants competed with each other with their cutting edge approaches to decommission nuclear facilities.

An Endeavor Leading Other Municipalities An Experimental Introduction of "RPA" in Nagaoka City Office



RPA stands for Robotic Process Automation, which is a form of business process automation technology utilizing the idea of software robots. RPA allows business operations with personal computers to be completely automated.

In order to achieve efficiency of business processes, the city experimented on data processing operations through utilizing RPA as part of the Nagaoka-based technological innovation project.

For instance, at one of the divisions of the city office, the data of employees' health checkups were processed via RPA, which can reduce manual working hours on personal computers by 117 hours per year. Therefore, the staff would be able to use these hours for other more human-based services.

According to a survey conducted by the Ministry of Public Management, Home Affairs, Posts and Telecommunications, less than 4% of municipalities across Japan have so far introduced RPA in their data processing operations.

At a session held at City Hall Plaza – $A\hat{o}re$ Nagaoka on January 10, 2019, the city gave reports about the experimental results of utilizing RPA. Mayor Tatsunobu Isoda stressed that the city would be able to provide better services for citizens based on such business efficiency acquired through utilizing RPA.

A Special FM Test Broadcast 📻

Important Information about Annual Income Reports ~Tax Withholding Slips and Filing Final Tax Returns~

If you are a registered resident in Nagaoka City as of January 1st, 2019, you are required to report your annual income to the City Office by Friday, March 15th 2019.

If you do not report your income by submitting a final income tax return form, various documents might not be issued including income verification certificates, which are necessary when applying for children's enrollment in nursery school, public housing, or business fund loans. Premiums for your National Health Insurance or Nursing Care Insurance and nursery school fees might not be calculated either. In Japan, income earners are required to pay income tax (shotokuzei しょとくぜい・所得 税) and residential tax (jûminzei じゅうみんぜい・住民税). The income tax is customarily deducted from your earnings when a payment is made by your employer. Then, the deducted amount for the income tax is paid to the government's tax office (zeimusho ぜいむしょ・税務署). This custom of prior deduction of income tax from your earnings is called gensen chôshû (Ifhth 525Lp3. 源泉徴収).

The appropriate annual amount of income tax to be paid is finally computed when all the earnings of the year are determined at the end of the year to find out whether you have paid too much or too little.

You are required to file a final income tax return if you have received payments from multiple employers. This filing is called *kakutei shinkoku* (かくてい しんこく・ 確定申告). For your earnings in 2018, you can file a final income tax return from Monday, February 18th to Friday, March 15th, 2019.

Tax withholding slips (gensen chôshûhyô げんせん ちょうしゅうひょう・源泉徴収票) that were sent to you from your employer(s) are needed when you file a final income tax return. In addition to this, due to the introduction of the Individual Number (Kojin Bangô/My Number) System, your individual number and personal identification documents (such as your residence card) are needed when you submit your final income tax return form and other necessary documents. If the total amount of your earnings is relatively small, there is a possibility that you will be able to have some of your income tax returned. This practice is called kampu (かんぷ・還付).

On the contrary, you may be required to pay additional income tax if income taxes have not been deducted from relatively large amounts of your other additional earnings.

As for the residential tax, no prior deduction is made. A bill (*nôzei tsûchisho* のうぜい つうちしょ・納税通知 書) for the residential tax will be sent to you in June (in June 2019 for earnings in 2018) when your total amount of earnings is determined. If your total amount of income for the year is relatively small, you will not be required to pay the residential tax. In such a case, a residential tax bill will not be sent to you.

Every individual working in Japan is required to pay the residential tax, regardless of his or her nationality. In principle, it is imposed on your total annual income beginning on January 1st of every year.

The residential tax must be paid to the municipality where you were registered as a resident on January 1st of that year. There are two ways of paying the tax. It may be deducted from your monthly wages, or you can pay directly to the city at a financial institution.

When paying at a financial institution, you have the choice of a one-time payment or a four-time installment payment.

The residential tax for this year, 2019, is calculated based on your total annual income for the year 2018. If you do not report your income by submitting a final income tax return form, the residential tax for the year cannot be determined. Please be sure to report your annual income of the previous year to the Citizens' Tax Division of the Nagaoka City Office or the Tax Division of each district office by Friday, March 15th, 2019.

The National Health Insurance System is a mutually supporting system in which members share their premiums to cover their medical expenses for injuries or illnesses.

If you are living in Nagaoka and are a member of the National Health Insurance Policy, you are required to pay your insurance premium by the due date. There is no exception for international residents.

When receiving medical treatment at a hospital, a holder of a national health insurance card usually has to pay only 30% of the costs. The members' insurance premiums are an important source to cover the rest (70%) of the costs. If you do not pay your premium by the due date, you may be requested to return your health insurance card or your property may be seized.

If you do not have a national health insurance card due to not paying your premiums on time, you will have to pay 100% of the treatment costs.

If it is difficult for you to pay your premium, please contact the consultation desk of *Kokuho Nenkin Ka*, the National Health Insurance and Pension Division at your earliest convenience.

This Month's Useful Japanese Expressions Nadare なだれ 雪崩 (avalanche) Nadare Chûihô なだれちゅういほう・雪崩注意報 (avalanche watch)

"Nadare" means avalanche, a phenomenon in which snow slides down hillsides. Avalanches happen when there is a heavy snowfall or the temperature suddenly rises. When skiing or mountain climbing, keep an eye on the different kinds of snowfall and pay due attention to temperature changes. You are also advised to be careful when driving along slopes with accumulated snow.

If a lot of snow starts falling and accumulating, weather forecasts often announce "nadare chûihô" meaning avalanche watch. Avalanches may happen even on clear days without any snowfall.

You are advised to check the areas in your neighborhood where avalanches are likely to happen. The disaster prevention map on the Niigata Prefecture Disaster Website shows locations where possible "nadare," or avalanches, are likely to happen. You can also access the map via your smartphone. You are advised to check for any hazardous areas around you with this map.

Warnings against PM 2.5

●Nagaoka *Chûô Sôgô Byôin*

Atmospheric particles less than 2.5 micrometers in diameter are referred to as PM 2.5, which are air pollutants. Because of their small size, the fine particles can enter deeply into the lungs, which can cause health problems such as asthma and bronchitis. The atmospheric concentration of PM 2.5 is constantly checked at 12 monitoring stations in Niigata Prefecture including Jôoka Monitoring Station in Nagaoka City.

If PM 2.5 levels become elevated:

- · The Niigata Prefectural Government Office will issue warning information
- Information will be distributed via radio and TV broadcast.
- · Nagaoka City will distribute information via its website and information vans as well as to schools and welfare facilities.

If PM 2.5 warnings are issued:

Refrain from going outside and avoid intense physical activities

- Wear a surgical mask when going outside.
- · Avoid opening windows or using ventilation unless absolutely necessary.
- · Children, the elderly, and patients with respiratory or circulatory problems are advised to be careful when moving around by carefully considering their health condition.
